issues for our Neighbors. But, this week one of our Neighbors who applied to us for rent help came to us almost too late to avoid eviction. We had worked with her several times this year to help her limp along, month to month. In housing she could not afford, this time she came to us only a few days before her initial eviction hearing. The amount she owed was way more than we had available to help her, and though we tried to put her in touch will other agencies, her time ran out for her first eviction hearing. She is now working with Aurora, with some possibility of making progress. We have committed to helping her with rent assistance in her next housing, hopefully somewhere she can better afford. There are eviction-avoidance safety nets for such folks, but they are not absolute or always successful. We pray for these Neighbors, and with the help of the parish, we do our best by them.


FIRST COMMUNION PARENT MEETING

22nd Sunday- Stewardship Lifestyle "Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." LUKE 14:13-14

One of the main principles of living a Stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

IT Manager


