ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS...

A few of this week's requests came from the Homeless Connect event staged by the City and assistance groups this past week. That even gets

these folks into "the system" of organizations dedicated to helping people get into housing, and help with their rent and utilities. Occasionally we get a Neighbor who this week, by the time we called on her, her rent had been paid by Catholic Charities. We had 5 CenterPoint, one water and 7 rents among the assistances we performed. The generous folks in this parish make much of this possible, and for which we are frequently and emotionally thanked. God bless you for making this possible.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning His Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would be known as the Sunday of Divine Mercy.

How to meet the requirements for Divine Mercy that God wants to give you through His Son.

- 1. Go to Confession within 20 days of Sun. April 27
- 2. Pray one Our Father
- 3. Recite the Creed
- 4. Receive the Eucharist
- 5. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father
- 6. Say one heartfelt prayer to Jesus.

This relieves one from temporal punishment and complete forgiveness of sin.
