We arranged for beds for the children and paid her CenterPoint deposit so that they can get started; "Mary" who has a disabled husband with a bad heart, and a son who lives independently but for whom she is spokesperson because of his emotional disability. We helped both mother and son with CenterPoint payments to help stave off disconnects. They, along with 11 others requested assistance from our St. Vincent de Paul Society. Your donations help our parish share the light of Easter! Here are a few simple ways that you can live out the eight weeks of Easter: Be joyful. Celebrate as a family. Add a spiritual devotion. 
