ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS... The rush to catch up with CenterPoint,

now that the winter shut-offs are no

longer prohibited, continues. Nine of our 16 Neighbors needed help with their gas and electric bills. We help with as much as we can afford and try to partner with other agencies such as the Township Trustee, CAPE, and Salvation Army to avoid service interruptions. Very often, the best we can do is work to avoid shut-off, which leaves unpaid amounts to be dealt with next month. Two of our volunteers met with a Neighbor who lost her house in an adjacent county. She has gone through rehab, and is staying clean. She is living in a room in a house of a friend, and though potentially disabled, she babysits when she can to get some living money. She now has significant health issues, and asks prayers that she can continue on her thus-far successful rehabilitation track, and have some economic stability. Her faith in the lord was palpable, and she feels He has been guiding her through the process. We have helped her with her rent, and have tried to give her some additional guidance on other programs she can access to become independent

We are called to do justice.

You have been told, O mortal, what is good, and what the LORD requires of you: Only to do justice and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God.

- Micah 6:8

Catholic social teaching is a central and essential element of our faith. Its roots are in the Hebrew prophets who announced God's special love for the poor and called God's people to a covenant of love and justice. It is a teaching founded on the life and words of Jesus Christ, who came "to bring glad tidings to the poor . . . liberty to captives . . . recovery of sight to the blind" (Lk 4:18-19), and who identified himself with "the least of these," the hungry and the stranger (cf. Mt 25:45). Catholic social teaching is built on a commitment to the poor. This commitment arises from our experiences of Christ in the eucharist.

How do we answer?

Our St. Vincent de Paul ministry serves the poor among us with charity. But charity alone is not enough. Which is why our justice ministry addresses the underlying issues that contribute to poverty. Chief among these is a lack of safe, affordable housing; rising costs for rents and utilities force many of our neighbors to make choices nobody should have to face.

Do I forego my insulin in order to pay the light bill?

Do I skip the grocery store this week so I can scrape together the rent money?

Maybe we can get some things at the food pantry to tide us over...

The problem of affordable housing is big. If we do not act, it will only get worse - and more and more families will suffer.

What is "affordable housing"?

Affordable Housing is defined as no more than 30 percent of a family's gross income for rent/mortgage, utilities, taxes and insurance. The average cost of a two-bedroom apartment in Evansville is about \$1030 per month and utilities are about \$200. To afford this, a family needs an annual income of \$49,000. If two people in the household are working, their combined wages need to be at least \$30/hour.

What we must do now.

On Monday, May 5, at 6:30 PM in the auditorium at Bosse High School (doors open 6:00 PM) we will publicly ask city leaders to ensure that Evansville's Affordable Housing Trust Fund is replenished and strengthened with a dedicated revenue stream for annual increases. Research shows this is a crucial step for a long-term and sustainable effort to make housing more affordable for low-income families. Here's how we will bring this forward.

Following the example of Nehemiah, who called a great assembly and demanded that the money-lenders end the usury that had forced the Israelites into slavery, we will assemble as one with our member congregations in CAJE (Congregations Acting for Justice and Empowerment). We need you to stand with us. The more people in attendance, the more powerful our insistence becomes, and the more likely city leaders will take the necessary action.

Will you give an hour of your time for the least among us?
