



About This First Issue

The Diocese of Evansville is launching a year long "Eucharistic Renewal" that will culminate in the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis from July 17 -21, 2024. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has requested that all the dioceses across the country participate in a Eucharistic revival for several reasons. In 2019, a Pew Research Study revealed that less than onethird of self-identified Catholics expressed a belief in the Real Presence. Additionally, the COVID-19 crisis forced the Church in the U.S. to suspend public liturgies. During this crisis, many of the faithful expressed a renewed desire for the Eucharist, but there is also a concern that some may lose the sense of the need for the Eucharist and not come back to regular Mass attendance. This first monthly issue of "Encountering the Eucharist" is intended to connect you with the rich Eucharistic Traditions and Teachings of the Catholic Church through articles on the beliefs, the worship, the lives of Saints devoted to the Eucharist, and ways we can share our Catholic identity with the world especially as it relates to Jesus' Real Presence in the Source and Summit of our faith: The Most Holy Eucharist. May you find this resource helpful.

get the word Monstrance from the Latin monstrare meaning to show, to point out, to teach. All these definitions are helpfu because this vessel is literally used "to show" the consecrated host to the people. It "points out" that who we are showing is Jesus truly present in the Eucharist. Finally, the monstrance "teaches" us to adore our Lord with proper reverence. Pope St. John Paul, II said, "The Eucharist, in the Mass and outside of the Mass, is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, and is therefore deserving of the worship that is given to the living God, and to Him alone." In the 16th century the monstrance took its present shape: a circular pane of glass set in a cross or surrounded with metal rays.
The host is placed in a holder called a lunette, which fits into an opening behind the glass.



Life in the Eucharist: St. Juliana of Leige



St. Juliana of Leige (1193-1258) was born in

Belgium. At the age of five, she lost her parents. Juliana and her sister Agnes were raised by the nuns at the convent of Mount Cornillon, She read the writings of St. Augus-

tine and cultivated an ardent love for the Blessed Sacrament. Juliana rewho pointed out that there was no feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Based on this, she promoted what we know today to be the feast of Corbus Christi, In her vision, Juliana saw the full

moon in its splendor crossed diametrically by a dark stripe. God gradually ceived visions from Christ, helped her to interpret the moon as the life of the Church and the darkness the lack of a feast in honor of the Body and Blood of Christ. We can learn from this that without the Eucharist, our life is in darkness and isolation.

Sharing Our Very Life: Eucharistic Processions

Processions are part of ritual and liturgy and are rich in meaning. In general they symbolize our earthly pilgrimage towards heaven. We are a pilgrim people, and we're making our way through life to God. A Eucharistic processing is a public witness of the veneration and adoration that we have as Catholics. A consecrated host is placed within a monstrance, which is then lifted up and carried by the priest who leads the faithful in the procession. These processions are, at the same time, an act of worship and a way of evangelization. We are telling the world about the Real Presence of Jesus.
