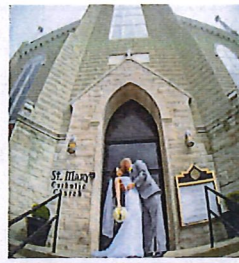

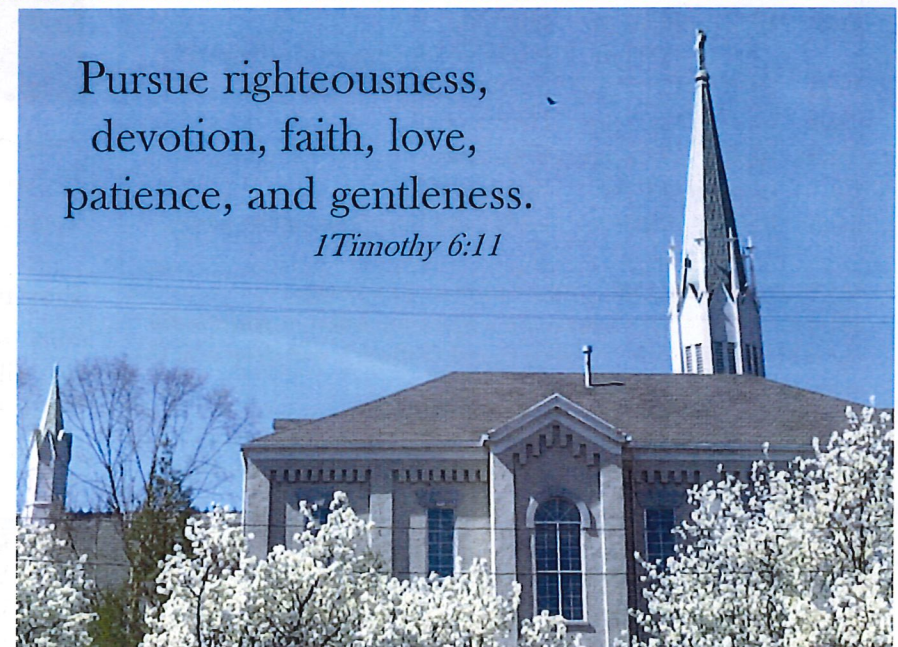

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS... This was a good week for some of our St. Vincent de Paul "neighbors." The committee was assigned 15 referrals, seven of whom wanted help either with CenterPoint or their water bills. CAPE (Community Action Program of Evansville) which administers our local share of federal assistance for utilities has just given out the last of the American Rescue Plan moneys for utility assistance. Three of our clients were helped by this "surprise" help to get caught up on their CenterPoint bills, so much so that they no longer needed money for their gas and electric bills. As is often the case, they had other needs to be met, so we shifted to their back rent, or in one case, to their overdue water bill. Besides rent help for some, we also helped a few others with vouchers to permit them to purchase household goods at the SVdP Thrift Store. All this is possible because of the support we receive. Thank you.

Stewards Bridge the Gap

"My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established" LUKE 16:25-26
