

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS...

We worked with 18 Neighbors this week. We continue to see folks who have just acquired housing,



and have little or no furnishings. We help those clients with household vouchers at the SVdP Thrift Store. New beds are expensive, but we will help pay for one if the Neighbor has the means to make up the remainder. Or, as happened a few weeks back, we can pair someone in the parish who is disposing of a used bed with someone who can really use it. The Store reports it really needs lamps—they "fly out the store". This week, we had an applicant who is training for his CDL driving license, has a job promised, but wasn't earning a paycheck while in school. He and his partner, and three children are at risk of eviction. We helped as much as we could, and referred him to Noah Werner at the SVdP District office for further counseling on other ways to keep his housing until he gets his first paycheck at his new job. We are so fortunate to not be in their shoes, but to be able to help. Thanks for all you do to help us help these folks.
